### Dramatic Reading: The Story of Turtle Island by Vicki Hughes





*Narrator:* Long ago, after the Great Spirit Kitchi-Manitou created human kind, the Anishinabe wandered away from their peaceful ways and began to fight amongst themselves. Brother fought against brother and sister fought against sister. Gone were the peoples' harmonious ways. Discord, jealousy and bitterness ruled the people. Seeing that the people had lost their peaceful ways and there was no longer respect for all living beings, Kitchi-Mantiou decided to cleanse the Earth by bringing about a flood.

After the flood some of the animals and humans survived and floated on a log. But there was no land on which to live and grow. A kind human raised her voice:



*Woman:* I am going to dive to the bottom of the water and grab a handful of earth. With this earth, we could make a new land on which to live.



*Narrator:* The woman dove into the water and disappeared for a long time. The humans and all the other species waited and waited. They thought that she had drowned. Finally, she surfaced, gasping for air



Woman: The water is too deep for me to reach the bottom.



*Narrator:* Then the loon spoke up:



*Loon:* I can dive deep into the water as that is how I catch my food. I will try to make it to the bottom and return with some earth in my beak.



*Narrator:* Loon then dove into the water. Finally after what seemed like the longest time, the Loon returned to the surface weakened and out of breath.



Loon: I could not make it; there must be no bottom to the water.



*Narrator:* After that, many more animals dove off the log and tried to reach the bottom to bring much needed earth to the surface. No one succeeded.

Finally the little muskrat spoke up.



*Muskrat:* I'll try!



*Narrator:* Many of the larger and stronger animals laughed saying that the little rodent was too small and weak. But then the wise raven said:



*Raven:* Only Kitchi-Manitou can judge others. Let the brave muskrat try.



*Narrator:* Off into the water went the muskrat. He stayed underwater for what was the longest time. However, underneath the water, the muskrat had indeed reached the bottom. Feeling exhausted and with his lungs screaming for air, he grabbed some Earth in his paw and used all his remaining might and strength to return to the surface.

Finally, when he returned he was unconscious, but he held a clump of earth in his paw.

All the others were humbled by his bravery. But none knew what to do next. Then Kitchi-Manitou took the earth and asked which soul would make a place for a new home to grow. Slow turtle swam up and said in a gentle voice:



*Turtle:* Use my back to take the earth, and bear the weight of a new place for all the land creatures to live.



*Narrator:* Kitchi-Manitou put the small piece of earth on the turtle's back. Suddenly, the wind blew from the four directions: North, South, East and West. The tiny ball of earth started to grow. It grew and grew until it formed an island in the water. The island grew larger and larger, heavier and heavier, but still the turtle bore the weight of the earth on his back.
